

Early Stage 1 Update - KG

Literacy

This fortnight KG looked closely at the quality text 'Banjo and Ruby Red'. Students discussed and planned their writing about the characters, setting, beginning, middle and end of a story before composing their draft. They have been working very hard to label the nouns in their plan, as well as some adjectives and adverbs that will help them make their writing extra interesting to their reader. Students have also been learning how to revise their work by adding in extra information or descriptions, and to edit their work by correcting punctuation and circling tricky words. We are very proud of the amazing writing that our little authors have been producing!

Numeracy

The big idea of learning in Kindergarten maths this fortnight has been that a fraction (like half) can mean half of an object, length or collection. KG have present lots of time consolidating this knowledge by finding half of different things. We know that half means two equal parts and that we can check that they are equal by counting or measuring. This term KG have also been working on their ability to show their answers to problems in different ways including through vocabulary, numbers, drawings and solving problems in more than one way.

Sport

Research shows that brain breaks can help refresh the mind and, for many students, movement is an ideal brain break. This is because exercise increases blood flow to the brain, which helps with focus and attention. KG have been enjoying the fresh air outside this term while they learn how to use a skipping rope as a brain break from all of their hard work in the classroom. One of the biggest lessons that KG have learnt is that practise makes better!




Stage 1 Update - 1MD

Literacy


In Literacy, 1MD have been exploring the picture book 'Tilly' by Jane Godwin. In this book, a young girl loses some precious treasures and learns to handle this loss. Our writing has been based on this text. Before planning our writing, we brought in our own special treasures and shared them with classmates. We had a chance to talk about memories connected to our treasures and discuss their importance. Here are some photos of us publishing our writing.







In Numeracy, 1MD have been learning about mass. Our challenge was to pack three bags and order them from lightest to heaviest. We could have more than one object in each bag and we were encouraged to choose objects of different sizes. We used hefting to order the bags and write our predictions and then we used an equal arm balance to check and compare the mass of each bag. Here are some photos of us comparing and ordering our bags using equal arm balances.







History

In History, 1MD have been learning about the changes that have occurred to the Cooks River over time. We explored how the river was used in the past and compared it to how it is used today. We have looked at historical sources such as old newspaper articles and photos and the amount of pollution in the Cooks River has shocked us. This week we are creating persuasive posters to encourage the restoration and preservation of the Cooks River.




Stage 2 Update - 3/4W

Literacy

The students have been learning about Historical Recounts and have been reading about the lives of many great men and women, in particular, we have studied Steve Irwin and his daughter Bindi Irwin. As a class, we have dissected a model text to learn how authors successfully use structural and literary features when creating a Historical Recount, then the students have applied it to their own writing. The students published their work on Google Classroom, ask your child if they can show you at home!





Numeracy

Money, money! This fortnight, the students in 3/4W have been learning how to represent money values in different ways and how they can apply addition and subtraction to familiar contexts when dealing with money. They have thoroughly enjoyed their learning experiences. The students have also been exploring the wide variety of strategies that we use for addition to help them become flexible, fluent and efficient mathematicians. They are doing this effectively, by providing reasoning, when solving problems.

Visual Art

We have been very, very busy during Term 3 getting our individual and class art ready for the art show next term! Students have created their own design, etched their design onto foil and painted a background using a variety of techniques. We are very happy with the end result! Literacy


In literacy, 5/6M students have been working on reading moderately complex texts with fluency. Each day, they partnered up and took turns reading for two minutes, followed by providing each other with constructive feedback. After their reading sessions, students focused on their literacy contracts, answering questions related to the text of the week, which further reinforced their understanding and comprehension skills.


Numeracy

5/6M students have been busy learning how to convert between different units of measurement. To reinforce their understanding, they engaged in fun games that made the learning process enjoyable. They also explored how to calculate the perimeter of irregular shapes by designing their own town and determining the perimeter for each building. It was

a creative and educational experience!







Visual Art

This term, 5/6M students have been exploring the fascinating world of natural disasters. In a creative art activity, they brought a volcanic eruption to life! First, they drew vibrant volcanoes using oil pastels on black or blue cardboard. Then, they enhanced their artwork by flicking acrylic paint from their brushes onto their volcanoes, creating a dynamic eruption effect. The results were both colourful and captivating!



1 Silver award + 5 Croydon Park Crests = 1 Gold Award





Together from these two great events we raised over \$5,000. Thankyou everyone for your incredible support!






