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NIDA Kidspeak Program

Year 4 and 5 students had the time of their lives last term when they showcased their creativity, stagecraft and performance skills by scripting and performing their own production in front of their peers, parents and staff.

Croydon Park Public School, in partnership with the National Institute of Dramatic Art (NIDA) joined to develop and implement an inspirational, integrated drama-based program aimed at developing students' literacy skills and engagement in learning.

The nine week *Kids Speak Program* was implemented by NIDA tutor Bronwyn Batchelor in collaboration with CPPS teaching staff. It focused on developing each student's competency in his/her speaking, writing and expressive skills while at the same time developing within themselves a stronger sense of self-worth and wellbeing. Throughout the program there was a focus on team work, collaboration, problem solving and mentoring.

In evaluating the success of this joint venture students have reflected on their learning and that of their peers. Students and parents declared the program a resounding success.

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Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

CPPS is participating in the first year of the national collection of data on students with disability. The data collection will be used to inform future planning by governments and educational authorities and will help us to better support the participation of students with disability in our school and all other NSW public schools.

The data collection will focus on the adjustments being made by teachers and schools to support individual students to access and participate in education. The data collection will have no direct impact on your child and they will not be involved in any testing. The data will be provided to the DEC in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified. When the data is passed on to the Commonwealth, the school name will be removed ensuring that the privacy and confidentiality of all students is protected.

Staff are currently undertaking professional learning introducing them to the Disability Discrimination Act and the Disability Standards for Education 2005. They are also collating evidence of adjustments and support they put in place to ensure all their students are accessing their education.

A letter providing full details about the data collection was distributed to all families yesterday. Please read this letter carefully as it provides the definition of disability under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992. Families who do not want their child to be counted in the data collection should complete the form attached to the letter and return it to school before 18 October 2013.

Performing Arts Night

School Self Evaluation

The school has begun the process of self-evaluation in preparation for the 2013 Annual School Report and our 2012-2014 School Plan. During this time the school community will be asked to participate in the review of educational programs and practices as well as report on specific target areas. A self-evaluation committee has been formed and will meet to review the data collected and make recommendations. The committee includes Mrs Denise Broadhead, Mrs Cathy Hudson, school captains Claire and Zahra and the school leadership team.
