Dear Parents and Carers,

Wellbeing Initiative

Last week, I had great pleasure engaging with all Stage 3 students in conversations about healthy and unhealthy signs during friendship interactions. Together, we were able to look at several scenarios and identify healthy, warning and unhealthy signs that can appear during friendship groups. It was great to conclude with strategies in resolving warning signs or having a trusted adult (parent/teacher) intervene when we recognise unhealthy signs.

This week our prefects have led team building activities across all Stage 3 classes. The activities have been planned by each school prefect. Our Stage 2 teachers have spent time discussing qualities of a good friend, followed by sharing of scenarios and identification of healthy, warning and unhealthy signs in friendships. Next week, our prefects will lead our Stage 2 students in team building activities. We also welcome Constable Jim Bottalico, Youth Liaison Officer to discuss Cyber Safety with our Stage 3 students.

School Assemblies Resume









TERM 2 IN THE LIBRARY OPEN


