Updated information regarding COVID- 19 pandemic

Please inform the school if you or your child needs to be tested for COVID-19 and not return to school until their test results are negative. Sick students should not attend school. Any child who is away for 3 or more days due to illness must provide a medical certificate.

This term schools are able to recommence the majority of school-based activities. This includes extra curricula activities such as dance groups, chess, violin and band. Gathering of larger groups of students, such as whole school assemblies are limited to 15 minutes. Physical distancing requirements remain for adults. All adults must continue to maintain physical distance from each other (1.5m), including teachers, support staff, parents and visitors.
