Dear Parents and Carers,

Keeping our children safe when dropping off and picking up at school

To increase safety measures, I have applied to the Road and Maritime Services for a lollipop supervisor to provide more protection for our children when crossing the road in Seymour Street. I will provide further information next term.

Unfortunately, I continue to receive complaints about unsafe driving practices such as U turns, three-point turns and double parking during drop off and pick up times in Seymour Street. I strongly encourage all parents and carers to be considerate of the safety of others.

Here are a few things we can all do to help keep our children and others safer during drop-off and pick-up times during the school week:

- Stick to the 40km/h speed limit in a school zone and look out for children who may be about.
- Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.
- Always park and turn legally around schools. Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous during busy school drop-off and pick-up times.
  - Drop your children off and pick them up on the school side of the road in our school's designated drop-off and pick-up area. Never call out to them from across the road - they may run to you without checking for traffic.
- It's safest for children to get out of the car through the Safety Door, away from passing traffic. This is the rear footpath side door of the car.

The safety of our students and school community is paramount. Thank you to all parents and carers who continue to be considerate in taking care and being considerate of others during pick up and drop off times.

#### SCHOOL HOLIDAY ROAD SAFETY - REMINDER FOR FAMILIES

With the school holidays approaching, daily routines will soon change. Different play locations and holiday destinations means different traffic environments. So to help keep our children safe, families are reminded about these key road safety points:

Stop, look, listen, think every time you cross the road. If your child is aged 8 years or younger hold their hand when walking near or across roads. If your child is 9-10 years old always actively supervise them.

It's the law that everyone wears a helmet when riding a bike in a public place.

It makes sense to wear a helmet when riding scooters and skateboards too!

*Click clack front 'n back* every person for every trip. Everyone in the car must be securely buckled up in the right seatbelt or child restraint.

Talk to your child about being a safe road user. Reinforce safe road behaviours by being a good role model! Children learn safe road behaviours from the adults who care for them. Talk about what you are doing to be safe when near roads, in the car and when riding.

**Point out road safety differences and dangers in new environments.** This is especially important when on holidays in different surroundings. Roads, footpaths, parks, carparks, bike tracks and bike lanes may look different in holiday areas.

The best way to keep your child safe is to actively supervise them. Talk and teach your child about road safety every time you are out an about.

#### Remind other adults who care for your children to do this too.

With one more week to go before the commencement of the school holidays, I would like to thank all parents and carers for your ongoing support with keeping our school COVID safe during this term. It has been a challenging time with

ongoing restrictions and I appreciate your ongoing support and cooperation. Wishing everyone a safe and relaxing holiday at the end of next week.



## <u>Literacy</u>



Over the past two weeks 3/4HI have been learning how to present a literacy circle. The students all read a short story and then were each given a role to present. We enjoyed sharing our work with each other and having in-depth discussions about the stories we read. In writing we have been practicing our persuasive writing skills - ask your kids what their thoughts are on whether or not Woolworths should be giving out Ooshies, or if computer games should have an automatic lock out after 2 hours! The students in 3/4HI have been practicing writing paragraphs with good structure - including linking sentences and examples!

#### Numeracy



In Maths 3/4HI have been practicing completing the 12x12 multiplication grid everyday - and boy are we getting quick! Many students can now finish the entire grid in under 5 minutes! This is a great task to practice at home too - having quick recall with the times tables is a great advantage in the years ahead! We have also been practicing addition and subtraction (including algorithms, much to the relief of many year 4 students!) and learning about different kinds of angles. See if you can find get your child to point out some right angles around the house this week!


## Street Art
