Updates to the Opportunity Class placement process for Year 5 entry in 2021

Information for parents/carers and students

To maintain the health, safety and wellbeing of students, the 2020 Opportunity Class Placement Test has been rescheduled to Wednesday, 18 November 2020.

To continue minimising the risk of COVID-19 transmission, students attending government primary schools will be tested at their own schools. All other students will be tested in designated external test centres.

Only students whose parents have received a confirmation email from the High Performing Students Team are eligible to sit the test on the new date of 18 November 2020. The application portal will not be reopened for new applications. These changes have been made to the placement process for this year only.

The revised application and placement process will ensure students are placed in Year 5 opportunity classes as early in 2021 as possible. The Department remains committed to supporting the continuity of learning and transitions for each child.

The Department continues to work closely with NSW Health to keep our students, staff and schools safe.

Parents/carers are encouraged to keep up to date with the Department's COVID-19 advice for families page, to ensure they are up to date with the latest advice.

A visual timeline showing the key dates is provided on the next page. Parents/carers are advised to note carefully the rescheduled dates.

<u>Literacy</u>

This term Kindergarten will be exploring how toys move. The unit will include an incursion in week 8. A note will go out in week 4.


