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Early Stage 1 Update

What's happening in KB!

As our first term in Kindergarten comes to a close we are enthusiastically awaiting Term 2 and all the learning and fun that comes with it.

English

This week in English, KB have continued to revise their prior letter sound knowledge and have acquired new skills in segmenting and blending words with newly learnt phonemes. We have been working hard to strengthen our camera word recognition and have built new sentences with Ms Betts. KB have also been exploring the wonders of Seesaw and using technology to share and reflect on our work in literacy rotations.

Mathematics

In Mathematics, we continued identifying numbers before and after and used concrete materials to add two groups together. As part of our morning routine, KB name the days of the week and sang songs to begin remembering the days in order. As a class we revised 2D shapes and sorted them according to their features.



History and Geography

In our combined History and Geography Unit over the term we have explored places we live in and learnt about our own family history. This week we have been discussing who is in my family, what is it about my family that is the same and different from other families, what makes my family special and where my family originates from. It has been an exciting week looking at world maps and painting family portraits and family trees.

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


Numeracy

2M students had fun exploring and learning about fractions and how two halves and four quarters make a whole. Students eventually figured out that two quarters were equal to a half! When the students became confident with halves and quarters, they learnt how to tell the time as 'half past' and 'quarter past/ quarter to'.



Music

To consolidate the Stage Science Geography unit on 'Weather', students in 2M had a blast making the perfect storm using musical















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Welcome to 4M!

Literacy

Over the term, year 4 have been reading the novel Storm Boy. Students have been thoroughly engaged in the story of Storm Boy and were excited to find out how it ended. This tied really well to our focus super six strategy of monitoring, where they use symbols to keep track of their understanding of the text. As the unexpected ending of the story came to a surprise to us all, an exclamation mark was the most appropriate symbol to demonstrate this.

Numeracy

Students have been extending on their knowledge of area through the exploration of square metres. To begin the week, students created their own metre rulers and put four together to see what a square metre looks like. After that, we used these rulers to measure the area of the 4M classroom which was 56m2. We also found that leg lunges were an alternative way to measure metres. Later in the week, we put this to the test when we did an outdoor maths lesson where students estimated the area of squares around the school including

windows, silver seats and the handball courts. From these hands on experiences, students are able to come up with real life examples of where we use square metres.

History

Stage 2 have been learning about community, in particular the Aboriginal and Torres Strait community. We have looked at what life was like our First People before British settlement. So far they have learned about The Dreaming, tools, totems, food, art and language. This week we learned about how they used natural resources for shelter. Students had a go at designing their own weatherproof shelter made from natural materials such as rocks, paperbark and leaves.

Some students presented their shelter design to their class.




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What's happening in 5M!

It has been entertaining and fun way to present all of the elements of persuasion this term. 5M have thoroughly enjoyed this and not to mention the increased confidence evident in all students.


Numeracy


