Dear Parents/Carers,

Drop off, Pick Up Arrangements and Friday morning assembly

# Early Stage 1 Update

### What's happening in Kindergarten!

I would like to welcome Miss Jessica Greenway who will be working with KAT till the end of Week 9. Miss Greenway is a pre-service teacher completing her third year of study.



### Literacy

This term Kindergarten students will continue to learn how to read and write in conjunction with phonological awareness. In week 3, students will start bringing home their home reading folders. Home readers will be changed on Mondays and Thursdays. There will also be the option to read books online through WUSHKA (details provided in the home reading bags). Home readers will match your child's current reading levels.

### Numeracy

This term Kindergarten will be learning: how to add and subtract numbers using concrete materials, compare heavy and light, compare the volume and capacity of objects and create a simple data display. Students are taught mathematical concepts through games and play. Next week KAT will be learning how to play 'Bump'. This is a great addition game that can easily be differentiated to suit the mathematical needs of the students.

### Science

This term Kindergarten's theme is 'How Toys Move'. On Thursday students participated in their very first incursion - 'Toy Science'. The students spent 2 hours playing and experimenting with toys. They had

### What's happening in 2S!

This week in 2S we are continuing to focus on our comprehension strategies to build our literal and inferred meaning when reading. To help us do this we are trying to read more complex and unfamiliar texts during silent reading and in the library. Writing book reviews is a great way of expanding our own knowledge of different texts while giving others an insight into the main idea of the story.

2H have had fun working in groups this week during mathematics on a range of hands on tasks to support their understanding of length, number and addition and subtraction. As a class we love practising our counting by playing 'Buzz Off Hairy Legs' and working on our fast addition facts when playing 'Beat the Champ'. This week and next week we are building our knowledge and understanding of counting by 3's.



### What's happening in 3W!

### Literacy

This week, students have been very excited on their return to school and have shared their holiday adventures with their friends. They recorded some of their experiences in their writing books including going to the Easter Show, going camping with their family,

spending time with cousins and road tripping interstate! Here are some samples of writing from our students.



### Numeracy

In maths students have reviewing 'whole been number' by investigating

four digit numbers and beyond. Students have participated in learning experiences that required them to identify place value through reading,

writing and ordering numbers. They have been encouraged to use the mathematical terms 'ascending' and 'descending' when ordering numbers. Students particularly enjoyed the game 'Closet to' this week. Maybe you could play this at home? All you need is a pack of cards.

### Excursion to Observatory Hill

Stage 2 students will be visiting Observatory Hill on Thursday Week 2 (3/4B, 4M and 4J) and Thursday Week 3 (3I and 3W). ### **Stage 3 Update**

### What's happening in 5C!

Welcome back everyone in Stage 3 to the new term. Now that the closing date for the expression of interest notes for the Canberra/Snowy Mountains excursion has occurred, final costs for the excursion can be determined. Next week a note will go home detailing the final cost and a schedule of payments for those people who prefer to pay by instalments. Extra detail about the camp will be provided later this term, such as medical information, dietary requests and clothing needs.

### Literacy

In Literacy 5C are learning improve their skills in writing narratives. A focus this week has been on activities that improve their descriptive writing skills and vocabulary, such as synonyms that demonstrate a greater degree of emotion, metaphors and similes. Students have written a narrative from a visual stimulus, which will be used as base line data for the term.

### Maths

In Maths, for the first two weeks we are working on multiplication and division, with division as the focus, as well as Area. In Area, we are working on calculating the area of rectangles and triangles. We are continuing to use the Ninja Numeracy program for daily practice of times tables, mental strategies and key skills. All Stage 3 students are also individually undertaking SENA testing during the first few weeks of this term to gather data and identify gaps in students understanding of mathematical concepts.

### Science

This term in Science, 5C are studying Living Things in Their Environment. This week, we have been examining Extremophiles, tiny living creatures that live in the most extreme conditions and Thermophiles which only live in places of extreme heat, such as volcanoes. 5C focussed their research on Tardigrades, which are the toughest animals on Earth, and what makes them unique and why they are so valuable for scientists to study. The accompanying photos show students researching Tardigrades in the computer room.
