Through this week and next, our students and teachers are engaged in learning experiences that value the diverse histories and cultures of First Nations People.

What's happening in KAT!

#### Literacy

Each morning KAT participate in literacy groups. During this time students work independently of a variety of activities. These include writing activities, segmenting and blending activities, reading activities, and speaking activities.

#### Numeracy

## **Stage 1 Update**

#### What's happening in 2H!

The 26<sup>th of</sup> May was 'Sorry Day'. Students in 2H read some wonderful texts which focused on the meaning behind this day and the importance of love for family and country. We discussed reconciliation and ways that people can show they are sorry.

#### Literacy

We have been busy bees during our literacy sessions. Students have been working hard in reading groups focusing on Reading to Write. We have been predicting, comparing predictions and responding to texts by focusing on the beginning, middle and end to enhance comprehension and meaning.



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#### Maths

Maths Wizards at Work - Learning about maths concepts can be so much fun!

\*We explored the volume of 3D objects through a robot challenge. Students worked collaboratively in small groups to create a robot with the volume of 24 cubes. We then looked at how all the robots had the same volume but were different shapes and sizes. A real eye opener for some! \*Students have also been exploring repeated addition and arrays as a way to better understand multiplication. By teaching through the use of hands on, concrete material, students gain a better understanding of the real world.



# Stage 2 Update

#### What's happening in 3/4B!

#### Literacy

While NAPLAN has obviously taken its fair slice of the Literacy and Numeracy cake this fortnight, students have still been working hard on their persuasive writing. Some fantastic points have been formulated, which makes sense, as kids often provide some of the most convincing arguments for something to happen or to not happen. This element of literacy was further reinforced when 3/4B was lucky enough to be the audience for the Stage 3 inter-school debating competition, as our school faced Croydon Public. All students came away with an extra level of knowledge about this difficult topic.

#### Numeracy

This week 3/4B has been busy and having fun building 3D objects from building cubes and drawing them from various perspectives. Students have explored the differences between prisms and pyramids and have really taken a shine to identifying 3D objects in the real world, pointing and identifying them unprompted. It's always a great indication of learning when kids make connections between their in-class activities and the real world.



#### NAPLAN

Year 3 students all undertook the National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) this fortnight. It can be a stressful time for students, teachers and parents but I am happy to say it was successfully completed for 2021. We won't know results for a while but a big congratulations to Year 3 for undertaking their first big exam.

## **Stage 3 Update**

What's happening in 6M!

#### Literacy

6M continue to focus on narrative writing and exploring how to engage readers through skilful plot development and evocative images and imagery that complement the story. Students have enhanced their stories with descriptive phrases linked to the 5 senses and the construction of complex sentences. 6M continue to be engaged by our shared novel, "Out of My Mind" and its themes of empathy, inclusion and respect.

All students now have the password to spellings lists for the NSW Spelling Bee and are encouraged to practice unfamiliar words to prepare for our class Spelling Bee in Week 8. Two finalists will represent 6M at the Stage Finals in Week 10.

#### Numeracy

In 6M, students have been calculating the area of 2D shapes such as rectangles (including squares) and triangles and exploring the relationship between area and perimeter. Students are also consolidating their ability to describe translations, reflections and rotations of 2D shapes and identify shapes that have rotational symmetry. We have also begun assessment tasks which will inform our teaching program in Semester 2. Students are encouraged to complete their set tasks on Mathletics and use the 'help' button for guidance on more difficult questions.

#### Science

In our unit, Living Things in Their Environment, 6M have been using technology to research why many animals migrate to find food and a better habitat as the seasons change, and others have evolved special adaptations which allow them to stay and survive harsher conditions. They have been focusing on summarising key points and presenting information visually in infographics or google slides. Students have also enjoyed creating a quiz to test their classmates knowledge!
