COVID Update

As the situation in Sydney is changing rapidly, some restrictions have been brought in that will affect schools. This is the current list, effective as of 24 June however, there may be more changes at the beginning of next term. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping our community safe.

Literacy

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
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


What's happening in 2M

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
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
What's happening in 4M!

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



Stage 3 Update
