Learning From Home



Following today's announcement from the NSW Premier Gladys Berejiklian, stay at home orders are to now continue until the end of September. I'd like to sincerely thank all our families for following the strong requests from NSW government and Department of Education to stay at home. We understand that learning from home is difficult however, keeping safe and following NSW health orders to stay at home is our highest priority in mitigating the Delta variant spread.

We want to remind all our families that our COVID safe school operations are now at **Level 4 Plus**. This means we are operating with an absolute minimum of 4 staff on-site for those students who cannot be at home, for example if their parent or carer is an essential worker. Thank you to all families who have continued to support our community by keeping their children at home to minimise movement in our community. Please get in touch with your child's teacher to discuss any additional needs for your child or family to support you to continue learning from home. Thank you for your ongoing support.

There's the option of turning on subtitles to support reading, and every story has a craft or learning activity to support it.
- <u>Britannica Library</u> makes it easy to find trusted information, with encyclopedia style articles, pictures and videos on every topic you can imagine.
- National Geographic Kids has a world of information about our amazing planet.

Burwood Library Audiobooks to enjoy

Audiobooks are a great way for children to experience stories, especially to relax at the end of the day. Burwood Library's <u>BorrowBox</u>, <u>Libby</u> and <u>Hoopla</u> collections all have children's audiobooks you can download to your device and enjoy at any time. <u>Story</u> <u>Box Library</u> has picture books read aloud online, with animations and craft activities to support the story.
