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

Spring



KG have been busy writing all about the weather this fortnight. This has included through daily writing in our class weather journal. After learning about different seasons, students have then been using drawing and quality talk to plan their ideas about what different types of weather looks and feels like as well as suitable activities and clothes. The quality of student writing has been so impressive - We are definitely almost ready for Year 1!



Numeracy

KG have been learning all about 3D shapes! Did you know that 3D shapes can be found all around us? Students investigated the properties different 3D shapes including their faces, edges and corners then tested which shapes would roll and which would slide. KG discovered that round and curved shapes are definitely best for rolling! KG have also been investigating data by creating their own weather graph that is added to each day. As you can see, we are so lucky to have had some sunny days this month!





Science

What better way to learn about the weather than to go outside! Last week KG engaged in a 'Spring Scavenger Hunt' and went outside to look for clues of the season. Students found green grass, flowers and insects that were all signs of spring! We also saw a butterfly, so of course we needed to make our own beautiful butterflies!








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Literacy

Year 1 have been learning about the skills of persuasion. When we try to persuade someone, we have to provide reasons why we believe the things we do. Why we should love spiders. Should we step on the ant? Or just why we think that certain book characters should react in certain ways. We have been enjoying the interesting discussions and we are always open to changing our minds but accepting when others don't agree with us.

Numeracy

Year 1 are always practicing efficient ways to add and subtract numbers and in 1W we work hard to recall our number facts quickly and accurately. When reading word problems, we must decide what strategy to use and solve the problem using pictures to help demonstrate our thinking. We have a new problem to solve everyday and all of us are getting better at determining what the problem is asking us to do.

Science

Year 1 have been learning about Our Living World. As a part of this unit, we have adopted some class pets! 3 stick insects. This unit teaches us about the external features of living things, what living things need to grow and survive, and how they change. We have also become experts at spotting very well camouflaged critters!


















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Stage 2 Update - 4J

Literacy



"I found it interesting that bees have 5 eyes that all of the bees in the hive are born from one queen bee." -Willow

For each source, students work in pairs or small groups to find interesting information about bees, comparing how facts are presented in different sources and debating which source is more valid or accurate. We have also been practising our unbeelievably funny bee puns and jokes.

Numeracy

In Numeracy we have been revising multiplication and division strategies. We have discussed lots of interesting new ways to solve problems like the lattice strategy, the Japanese (or Chinese or Indian) line strategy as well as the area strategy, algorithm strategy and split strategy. 4J especially enjoyed short division which we learned for the first time.

"We have been learning different strategies including some strategies we have never seen before including lattice and Japanese strategy. These strategies are kind of hard, but we mostly mastered the easier strategies like split and algorithm." -Maeve and Emma




PDH

In personal development and health, 4J have been discussing child protection, life changes, resilience and positive environments over the last few weeks. This week we discussed taking responsibility for our actions. We shared our ideas on how, our actions can positively or negatively affect ourselves and others.







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Literacy

This week 6S have been learning about how to write informative texts. We have learnt how to identify good and bad texts and how to fix them. We have been focusing on topic specific language to help us create better informative texts, and have learned to identify opinion in a factual text. We have also been doing book club everyday. During book club, we work in groups. Each week, we set roles for each member of the group and read a certain amount of chapters or pages of our book, then come together to discuss it.

Numeracy

In maths we are practising our time, multiplication, prime and composite numbers, grid references and map skills to show how we use our number knowledge. As well as learning about square and triangular numbers, we made a model of how to figure out triangular numbers with counters. We then tried to find a way to explain how to find any number in the triangular number pattern.

Science

In science we have been learning about weather patterns and natural disasters. 6S have been doing some science experiments. Each group has created either a thermometer, anemometer or a barometer and over the past few weeks we have been recording data about the weather patterns. Our group made the thermometer. We made it using clay, a straw, rubbing alcohol, a small bottle and food dye. We have recorded some interesting results and have compared these temperatures both in and out of the classroom. We are then going to link this to our lessons on bushfires to find the connections.

Fun Day

Funday was held on the 8 of November. It was very successful and we raised over \$3000, which will go towards our year 6 farewell!! There were 18 different stalls, each with different activities to enjoy. Some of the many stalls were Spectacular Sundaes, Cool Carnival games and Haunted maze. All of the stalls were very busy and earned lots of money. We were all very tired but very pleased with our efforts. –By Evie and Emmily
