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Classes for 2023



Based on our current enrolment numbers for next year, we have now formed 16 classes.

Classes for 2023 include 15 single grade classes, 1 composite class and job share arrangements. The placing of children into new classes is a complex and time-consuming process as we strive to ensure that we have well- balanced classes. Classes at Croydon Park Public School are not academically graded. When forming balanced classes, many factors are taken into consideration: gender, academic ability, special needs such as learning support, English as an additional language and dialect, behaviour and social needs, medical needs and learning behaviours. Teachers also request students to identify friendships in an attempt to place each child with a nominated friend in their class. Thank you for respecting teachers' professionalism as they place students in a class that will best meet their educational needs.

Literacy


- 'I learn't how to write my own sentence because before Kindergarten I didn't know how to write any words. Now I can write a full on sentence!' -

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Literacy

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This Term, 2M have been practicing writing and presenting impromptu speeches to their peers. Students are given a topic and 10 minutes to write their speech. They then take turns presenting their speech to the class and afterwards receive constructive feedback from their peers. This improves their skills to think quickly on their feet, to develop confidence to speak in front of an audience, to improve their oral expression and to learn to provide constructive feedback to others.



Numeracy

2M had a great time learning to measure the mass of objects using informal units such as marbles, base ten blocks, connecting cubes and dominoes. They had a lot of fun working in small groups using the balance scales to work out the weight of objects found around the classroom.



Science

In Term 4, 2M have been learning fun and interesting facts about their class pets, Chloe and Liam, the spiny leaf insects. For instance, spiny leaf insects are also known as Giant Prickly Sticks and live up to 18 months. Students in 2M have had a lot of fun getting to hold their insects and discovering fun facts every week about their class pets!















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Stage 2 Update - 4B

Literacy

In literacy 4B have worked hard creating their own imaginative texts about honeybees. The focus while writing was including specific language features such as descriptive language, similes and personification. We took a deep dive into the revising stage of writing to ensure we were critically reflecting on our work to make it our best. Together, with 4J, students gave feedback on each other's work in small groups. This process of giving feedback, then reflecting on that feedback proved a valuable tool as our final published Bee Stories were beerlliant!

Numeracy



This week in mathematics, 4B were focusing on revising whole number to help us prepare for Stage 3. We played games involving reading, writing and ordering numbers up to 100 000.

Science



In Science, we investigated the special relationship between flowers and bees and explored how bees are important for the survival of a variety of other living things. One of 4B's many science experiments included the use of a balloon and different coloured powders as a fun way to learn about pollination.



4B has had an exciting year learning together. 2022 being my first year on Year 4 has been a very memorable year for me includ-



ing all the fun we had at camp. This week students in 4B received their Pen Licenses! I wish all students the best of luck in Upper Primary!



Chess is a valuable activity for children, developing their logical thinking skills, concentration and discipline, as well as being a source of much enjoyment! What a great way to combine learning and fun!

These classes begin with an interactive lecture by one of our experienced coaches. During the second half of the lesson children play games against each other, putting newly learned strategies into practice.

As the term progresses and the children become proficient in all the basics, the lectures will move on to more complex ideas such as strategy, middle game ideas and chess technique.
