

Here are a few things we can all do to help keep our children and others safer during drop-off and pick-up times during the school week:

- Stick to the 40km/h speed limit in a school zone and look out for children who may be about.
- Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.
- Always Park and turn legally around schools. Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous during busy school drop-off and pickup times.
- Drop your children off and pick them up on the school side of the road in our school's designated drop-off and pick-up area. Never call out to them from across the road they may run to you without checking for traffic.
- It is safest for children to get out of the car through the Safety Door, away from passing traffic. This is the rear footpath side door of the car.

Attendance

We appreciate all the effort that families are making to ensure that students don't come to school if they are feeling unwell. We know that this means families are using their supply of RATs responsibly. This has greatly reduced the number of students who are presenting at school with COVID-19 symptoms. While students are COVID-19 negative, the number of students with cold and flu has made a sharp rise in recent weeks. Be reminded that it is still vitally important that students with cold and flu symptoms remain at home until they are symptom free and come to school only when they are well.

Winter has come a few days early this year! As a result, we would like to take this opportunity to remind families to ensure students are wearing their full school winter uniform including a 'named' jumper or jacket - particularly on cold windy mornings.

Free Flu Shots from 1 June!

Please see this very important message from NSW Health:

A free flu jab will be available to all NSW residents in a month-long blitz from June 1 in an effort to combat this year's expected severe influenza season. With a sharp increase in flu cases already, the NSW Government will fund flu vaccinations at GPs and pharmacies until June 30. "We strongly urge everyone over six months of age to get a flu shot as soon as possible to protect themselves and their loved ones, as the virus is easily spread and potentially deadly. " Dr Chant said. NSW Health has also permitted pharmacies to administer flu vaccines to children aged five years old. reduced from 10 years, making it easier for families to be vaccinated together. Late arrivals

In the last few weeks, we have seen a consistent pattern of some students arriving late to school. Whilst a couple of minutes here and there does not mean much, regular missed time at school can have a negative impact on children.

Lateness to school can increase anxiety in children. 


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Literacy

Numeracy

Literacy

1W have been focussing on some fabulous literature in class, most recently we have been reading *Tom Tom* and *Tilly*. These books then become the focus for our writing in class as they provide the students with repeated modelling and practice

of the skills and strategies that great writers use. Tilly showed us the significance of precious things and memories in our lives and it has been fabulous, seeing all the precious items coming in from home. After the children were given the time to discuss what makes these things precious to them, they then had the opportunity to write about their significance. But what would happen if they were lost? How would we cope? Tilly shows us how to be resilient,

how to hold things in our memories, but then how to move on and create new ones. What a great story.



Skip counting has never been so important as it is in 1W at the moment! How else would we know how much money we have? While we have proved to be great at counting by tens, and fives on and off the decade, when we are counting money we need to be flexible and count up by twenties and then change to tens and then fives. 
Numeracy

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
