Literacy

Each week, Kindergarten have been reading lots of different quality literature books that are linked to our learning in science. Together we pose and ask questions about the story, including questions that require

students to infer meaning using their own background knowledge. This rich conversation and the vocabulary that comes from it is then used in student writing. To consolidate our literacy learning each day, KG participate in a range of literacy group activities. Their favourite part is sending pictures of their work home for parents and carers to see! We are proud of our learning in KG!



Numeracy

Kindergarten have been learning to add using feet! We read the book called 'One is a Snail, Ten is a Crab' and looked at the different ways that larger numbers can be built using smaller numbers, or legs. KG investigated and discovered that numbers can be built in lots of different ways, or using lots of different legs. Students even made their own 10-legged crabs! Did you know that you can make the number 100 using ten crabs or 100 snails?!

Science

The Kindergarten science topic for term 2 was 'Toys', including how and why they move. KG had so much fun working in groups to design and construct toys this term. For our most recent project, students chose to design and make either a car or a boat. This included making a labelled diagram of their toy, planning the materials needed and then decorating their toy. Thank you to all of the families who sent in lots of recycled materials to make these projects possible!











Stage 1 Update - 2M

Literacy

This Term, 2M have been learning the **five processes of writing** using informative texts. Students have learnt that to write quality texts, they need to plan their ideas by sketching or jotting down key words or phrases. Then, they use notes from their plan to extend on their ideas to write a draft. After that, they revise their draft by checking text and sentence structure and choice of vocabulary to ensure that their writing makes sense. Students then edit their work, checking that spelling and punctuation is correct. Finally, they publish their work in their best handwriting!

Numeracy

The Array City Project is perfect for demonstrating student understanding of rows, columns, groups of and repeated addition. 2M created a city building at night - the lit windows forming an array. The students were thoroughly engaged in making their own buildings out of black paper and using coloured paper for their windows. After the windows were glued, they needed to write how many rows of windows there were on each building and how many windows were in each row. This showed their understanding of rows and columns. Then, they needed to write a repeated addition sentence to connect their understanding to arrays. Students also practiced writing their arrays as a multiplication sentence.

Geography

In Geography, the students have been learning all about sustainability and how to protect our natural environment. We integrated our read to text, '**A Forest**' into our Geography unit where the students learnt the importance of looking after our natural environment and the consequences of cutting down a forest. Students formed small groups and using large pieces of paper, they created a mind map of all the ways we can look after our environment.













Stage 2 Update - 4B

Literacy

In literacy this week 4B have been examining the picture book 'Drought' by taking a closer look at the literary devices used by Jackie French. One lesson, focusing on personification, we spoke about why the author chose to describe drought as having hands and drew our interpretation of what drought may look like as a person. In writing we have been using 'Drought' as a springboard for persuasive writing. Taking a closer look at some letters written by children who were affected by drought in Australia in 2019, we wrote our own persuasive letters urging all families and governments to take action and support rural communities who are affected by drought.



The topic we explored in mathematics this week was position. We looked at lots of different maps and grids to represent position, using north-east, south-east, south-west and north-west to describe the location of an object. Position was tied closely to our excursion this week to the Royal Botanical Gardens. Part of the day included navigating a map of the gardens and plotting different places we explored using specific grid references.











Stage 3 Update - 6S



Literacy

6S have enjoyed working with complex picture books throughout term 2 to assist in their understanding of 'authors purpose', unpacking the inferences and complex vocabulary. We have read some amazing books including 'Woolvs in the Sitee' by Margaret Wild, 'The Lost Thing' by Shaun Tan and 'The Water Tower' by Gary Crew. We love a good mystery and we are looking forward to continuing to find great books to 'unpack' in term 3.





Numeracy

6S have been working on their understanding of multiplication and division as inverse operations in mathematics throughout term 2. To help us consolidate our skills we completed a rich mathematics task called 'Let's run 5km'. In teams, we discussed and made 1 square meter out of cardboard and used it to measure the area and perimeter of the grass area. From there, we agreed on the overall perimeter and how many kilometres we were committed to running. Each day we now run/walk for 6 minutes, counting the number of laps we do each day. When we return to class, we multiply the laps by the perimeter to find our total. It has been a great way to integrate lots of mathematical concepts and consolidate the process required to find our total distance.

PBL Disco

On Wednesday of week 10, stage 3 enjoyed a our PBL 'Glow disco' in the hall. After a very busy term it felt great to let off steam and dance it out. The outstanding behaviour from the students in 6S, especially at camp, meant hat everyone attended and had a fantastic time. Great job everyone!
