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Early Stage 1 Update - KM

Literacy

KM have been busy at work this term. Throughout literacy we have learned 4 new phonemes, 'sh, ch, th, wh'. KM brainstormed and built words with these corresponding sounds. In addition to this, we used puppets to build conversation with the inclusion of our new camera words, essentially encouraging listening and speaking. KM enjoyed embedding drama components in literacy and taking on another character. In writing, we have been working to make connections from our farm visit into our writing. We wrote about our favourite part of the Calmsley Hill Farm excursion and the animals they saw, touched and heard. We have focused on adding more ideas throughout our sentence writing. Kindergarten students have observed what a good piece of writing looks like with our living eggs chick journal. Students collaboratively communicated the changes observed with the chicks each day and as a class composed sentences, along with a corresponding drawing.

Numeracy

In numeracy this week, KM explored the concept of 'position', specifically the terminology including; over, under, above, beneath, next to, behind, on and to the right/left of. Students used this language in a pair activity, by giving their partner a 'position' instruction using coloured blocks. Additionally, KM were given a farm scenery in which they had to listen carefully to the position directive, to ensure the features of the farm were in the correct position.



Science

Kindergarten have been taking good care of our 8 chicks. Students are very careful to hold and gently pat the chicks, ensuring that they feel comfortable and safe. We discussed the lifecycle of a chicken and created a spinning wheel with our Year 6 buddies, representing the egg, hatchling, chick and then an adult chicken. Kindy have been successful in making connections between living and non-living things as well

as what a living thing needs.

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

Numeracy

1W have been working hard on learning our number facts for addition and subtraction. For example, when we know that double 6 equals 12, then we can easily know that 6 + 7 = 13. When we know that 7 and 3 are friends of ten, then we can easily know that 7 + 4 = 11. This way of adding is much faster and more reliable. Year 1 have been playing lots of games to practice near doubles and near tens.

Visual Art

1W are preparing for the 2022 Art Show! We are closely looking at the work of Penny Evans, an indigenous ceramicist. Her technique of sgraffito (carving into glaze) celebrates Gamilaraay/Gomeroi traditions of carving. We have been busy planning out our designs and are almost ready to begin carving! The students ask me every day if today is the day that they can get their hands on the clay! Soon kids...soon. I'm just as excited.





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Literacy

3/4I have been learning about information reports this term. This week we have focussed on technical language, in particular, noun groups. We have also been reading a variety of different styles of information reports, found both in books and on the internet, noting that informative texts do not always look the same or follow the same structure. We have read many Jeannie Baker books. Both Circle and The Hidden Forest are narratives and have informative texts within them.

Numeracy

We are currently learning about fractions and decimals. We are learning about mixed numerals and improper fractions and equivalent fractions as well. Ms Isaac says that we should always use pizza and chocolate when we are learning fractions! Some of us drew a fraction wall in our books, and we all did our quizzes.

Art

With Ms Isaac we have been working on Jeannie Baker collages. We are focussing on working with different colours, and blending them. With Ms Maddison, we have started our individual projects for the Art Show. We are making sculptures inspired by Marlene Rubuntja who is an Indigenous Australian female artist. We are using hessian and are going to sew some wool and smaller pieces to make extra shapes on our sculptures for the art show.
