

Attendance- late arrivals



In the first weeks of this term, we continue to see a consistent pattern of some students arriving late to school. Whilst a couple of minutes here and there does not mean much, regular missed time at school can have a negative impact on children.

Lateness to school can increase anxiety in children. Often lateness contributes to children missing daily organisation explicitly articulated to the class or the first part to their literacy session. Your child's best learning time starts at the beginning of every day.

Keeping our Students Safe



Unfortunately, I continue to receive complaints about unsafe driving practices such as U turns, three-point turns and double parking during drop off and pick up times in Seymour Street. I strongly encourage all parents and carers to be considerate of the safety of others.

Here are a few things we can all do to help keep our children and others safer during drop-off and pick-up times during the school week:

- Always Park and turn legally around schools. Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous during busy school drop-off and pick-up times.
- It's safest for children to get out of the car through the Safety Door, away from passing traffic. This is the rear footpath side door of the car.

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Early Stage 1 Update - KC

Welcome back to Term 4 Kindergarten! All of KC are so excited to be back, as we have so many exciting events coming up this term!

Literacy

The literacy cycle for the beginning of this term focuses on how characters are represented in texts. KC have been reading the book 'Nannie Loves' and we have been exploring the nouns, verbs and adjectives within the book. Students have been sharing their own memories of things that their own Nannie loves and have been sharing through drawing and writing tasks. KC have being using nouns, verbs and some adjectives in their own writing and are able to identify them by circling or underlining.

Numeracy

The mathematical cycle for the beginning of this term focuses on combining, separating, comparing and forming groups with quantities. KC have been looking at a variety of different collections of items such as: cups, pens,counters, magnets and dominoes. Students have been using their knowledge of numbers to estimate how many items are in each collection before counting them. KC used this estimation technique when looking at a book called 'The Shopping Basket', which follows the story of a boy who begins losing items in his shopping basket, students followed along and used a range of materials to help them.







Science

This term Kindergartens science unit is all about weather. We have started the unit off strong by exploring what we already know about weather and what we want to learn. KC had some great facts that they already knew about weather which included; the weather can change, in summer it is hot, in winter it is very cold, it can snow in Sydney, when it is raining and sunny it makes rainbows and rain comes from the sky. The questions from our discussion about what we wanted to know about weather included; how does rain stop and starter so quickly, why don't we see snow in sydney, how does the sun burn us, how does the sun reflect on the ocean and how does the sky change colours. KC are looking forward to answering these questions and exploring our weather unit.










Stage 1 Update - 1W

Literacy

So far this term, 1W have been reading "Fantastic Mr Fox" by Roald Dahl. We have enjoyed reading this longer story and discussing the characters and their actions. In response to this story, we have prepared an interview. From the perspective of the smallest fox, the children have written and answered interview questions about Mr Fox. eg: "How would you describe your dad?" Next week we are going to video record our interviews.

Numeracy

This week 1W have been learning about arrays.

Teacher: What makes a good array?

Lucas It has to be organised and have structure.

Teacher: What do you mean by structure?

Lucas: It has to have columns and rows. Straight horiziontal lines and straight vertical lines.

In 1W we understand that a good array has mathematical structure. This helps develop the way we think about numbers, enabling us to easily split them and partition them when we need to problem solve. To finish our learning on arrays we made some with fruit loops (they're for maths, not for eating!) and sequins. We also had fun playing kahoot to consolidate our learning in maths.



Science


Stage 1 have been exploring how data is represented as pictures, symbols, numbers and words in digital technologies. This new learning is becoming increasingly more important in our digital age as students learn how to access information from digital images, hyperlinks and from different texts, such as podcasts.

Stage 2 Update - 3W


Literacy


This term in literacy, students in 3W and Stage 2 will be learning about texts that entertain and will be exploring characterisation and theme in poetry and narratives. This fortnight, we have been looking at the text 'Do Wrong Ron' by Steven Herrick. A hilarious novel that is written in free verse poetry about an accident-prone boy whose heart is in the right place. The students have been learning to read poetry, responding to accuracy, rate, expression and punctuation. They analysed the literary features used by Steven Herrick through a close reading, then wrote their own free verse poetry! It has been challenging, but a lot of fun too!

Numeracy

3W have been exploring regular and irregular 2D shapes and folding different shapes to find how many lines of symmetry they have. What the students found most interesting, was that a regular 2D shape has the same number of lines of symmetry as it does sides and angles. The students also looks at symmetry in art and the environment. They collected leaves and flowers from the playground, and drew the mirror symmetry.

Odd and even numbers! 3W have also been identifying odd and even numbers and can now explain and show the difference between odd and even numbers by drawing arrays.








Drama

Further to our work in literacy and study of characterisation, students are also analysing characters through drama and the text 'The BFG'. The students will be exploring the elements of drama the preparation of short plays and readers theatre. Within our first two lessons, students had a lot of fun participating in short games, role play and hotseating.








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Stage 3 Update - 5B

Literacy

This will be an exciting term in Literacy as Stage 3 explores the pertinent topic of Artificial Intelligence. As you may know, all state Education Ministers agreed to allow certain uses of Artificial Intelligence, such as ChatGPT in the classroom from 2024. So we are ahead of the game, with students right now learning what it is and how it works and writing information reports to support this. Further into the term, students will write their own Science Fiction narrative texts based on what they know. Finally, our young literary scientists will persuade us of the possibilities or risks associated with Artificial Intelligence. Interesting times ahead!


Numeracy


Class 5B has been learning all about factors and multiples in numeracy, as well as some work on angles too. The former is a particularly important concept for students to get their heads around in Year 5, as it forms the basis for much of their multiplication and division in Year 6, as well as enhancing their all-important mathematical reasoning.



Science

This term, we will be learning all about solids, gases and liquids. What are they made of? Can they change to become like each other? This is a great unit as students get the chance to do same fun (and safe!) hands-on experiments with solids, liquids and gases.

BORROWING






