


### **K-2 Athletics Carnival**








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# **Early Stage 1 Update - KE**

# Literacy


Students in KE have been learning about adjectives. We have used different adjectives to describe animals on the farm during our writing lessons. We have had fun learning about all different farm animals. Look at some of our writing about sheep and cows.

### **Numeracy**

In mathematics, KE are learning to share collections by forming equal groups. We are learning to recognise equal and unequal groups and we used concrete materials to demonstrate this. We enjoy our hands on mathematics lessons.







### **Science**

In Kindergarten, we are learning about farms and how farm products meet our needs. This week we cooked damper, made butter, and made fresh orange juice. We used foods that all come from different types of farms. We had so much fun cooking! During our science lessons, we have also been learning about living and non-living things.













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# Stage 1 Update - 1R

### Literacy

In 1R we have been working very hard in our writing time. We have been looking at how different characters in a story can see the same situation from a different angle. We have even written our stories or letters from a chosen character's perspective, putting ourselves in the shoes of others as it were. We are learning to edit our writing and we know when we read our writing it has to make sense. We are improving every week.

### **Maths**

In mathematics we have been looking at patterns. We have been making patterns of our own and showing how we can make the same patterns with actual numbers in the hundreds chart.





### Art

In art we have been looking at cartoons and characters. We have been drawing our own cartoons focusing on features and form. We have been working on some characters in the digital format as well. I am going to leave this without any photos as we need to surprise you at the art show this term.





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




# Stage 2 Update - 4H

### Literacy

This term, we have been working on our informative writing skills. The last fortnight, we studied humpback whale migration and accessed information on their migration through books and videos. We practiced our note taking skills, learnt new vocabulary while working on our informative writing skills. We followed the writing process of planning, drafting, revising and editing before publishing them onto Google Slides.



### **Numeracy**

We have been working really hard on our multiplication and division knowledge! We practiced our timetables almost every day and made a game using them. This week in particular, we revised that multiplication and division have an inverse relationship and students were happy to find out that division wasn't as difficult as they thought!



# **Visual Arts**

We have been making steady progress with our art works and it has been pleasing to see students' ideas come to life as we add on first and second coats of paint! Our artist is Osa Rosti, who uses recycled cardboard to build her sculptures before using modrock or papier mache to prepare them for painting. Her artworks use bright, contrasting colours and the students of 4H have really nailed it!








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# Stage 3 Update - 6T

This term in maths, 6T had the opportunity to improve their understanding of position with the use of compass points and looking at maps. They gained improved understanding of grid lines and coordinates as well as compass directions. To consolidate all they learnt the students spent a lesson outdoors giving one another compass directions to get from one spot on the playground to another. This lesson allowed many students to recognise that north simply did not mean in front of you but the correct direction of North in relation to where they were standing. It was a fun and engaging activity!

Term 3 is always hectic at CCPS as all classes prepare for the art show. 6T's classroom could best be described as organised chaos as we had began the creation of our artworks. Our inspiration comes from Australian artist, Carinne Meyerink, a textile collage, watercolour and mixed media artist. We hope our finished products look as flawless as hers!

Week 5 was National Science week. This was a great opportunity to try new science












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# **Stage 1 Tram Excursion**

### Come teach ethics at Croydon Park Public School

We are building an ethics program at Croydon Park Public School with lessons delivered by Primary Ethics volunteers.

Ethics lessons are now offered to students in years Kindergarten – Year 6. In ethics, students explore everyday issues suitable for their age. They learn to listen closely to each other, to disagree without putdowns and to think carefully as they form their opinions.

We need two (2) more volunteer ethics teachers so that all parents have the option of choosing ethics classes for their child.

You can teach ethics if:

- · You're interested in what children think and you have an interest in learning.
- · You're willing to learn how to use our lesson scripts to ask children ethical questions.
- · You can remain neutral and give the children space to think.
- · You're available each school week on **Tuesday 2pm 3pm**: you'll need about an hour each week to prepare and give the scripted lesson.
- You complete our free training and pass background checks.

You will join a great community of Primary Ethics volunteers – at Croydon Park Public School and across NSW. You'll have the rewarding opportunity of listening to the fantastic students at our school and helping them grow. You'll develop new skills yourself – facilitation skills, plus skills in communication and active listening.

Primary Ethics provides free, comprehensive training with online self-paced learning plus trainer-led workshops (by Zoom or face-to-face).
