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Early Stage 1 Update

Literacy

This week KG have enjoyed shared reading of the quality picture book 'Chip' by Kylie Howarth. Students acted out different parts of the story to deepen their understanding and create text to self connections. They then created a labelled diagram of a seagull then composed a descriptive text about a seagull in disguise and an informative text about the different things that seagulls do. KG learnt that all sentences need a subject and a verb and had fun changing the subjects and verbs in a range of sentences.



Numeracy


In Numeracy this fortnight KG have been developing their knowledge, understanding and skills of representing numbers 0 to 10 and part-whole combinations up to 10. Students enjoyed engaging in a variety of games to support subitising and estimation, with their favourite being 'Pinch 10'. In this game students had use their skills of estimation in order to 'pinch' a pile of 10 counters, which were then sorted into groups based on whether they were 10, less than 10 or more than 10. KG also enjoyed exploring using rekenreks to represent different numbers and number combinations.



Sport

KG have been loving learning new gymnastics skills in their PE lessons with Mr Wes each week. Students have been using a range of gymnastics equipment such as trampolines and balance beams to develop their gymnastics skills, including jumping and landing techniques, balance and rolling.














Literacy

This week 1W have been spending time reading Jeanie Baker's book "The Hidden Forest", a story about a young boy, Ben whose fish trap gets caught and he's forced to go underwater to retrieve it. It's clear that he fears what lies below, but what follows is a remarkable and magical adventure into the hidden kelp forest. Jeanie Baker uses her stories to impart vital ecological lessons for us all and as we read our appreciation of nature grows, along with Ben's. We are in the process of creating a text about the importance of respecting our environment.

Numeracy

1W know all about 2D shapes. We have learnt that we can create new shapes from existing shapes by adding one more side, and when we do this we understand that a vertex is also added. This week we have been moving, flipping, and rotating shapes, creating shapes by combining other shapes and finding smaller shapes in larger shapes.







KLA

Every Friday morning, Stage 1 come together to be active and have fun. Some of our favourite equipment is:

- The launches and beanbags. When we step onto the launch it throws beanbags high into the air for our partner to catch.
- Scoops. Catching the ball in a scoop is quite challenging but very rewarding when we land it. It appears that there are many other uses for a scoop as well, see picture below.
- Hula hoops. One of the more entertaining times of my day is watching 1W wiggle with a hoop!









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Stage 2 Update - 4I

Literacy

In Literacy over the past fortnight we have enjoyed exploring the text 'Meanwhile Back on Earth' by Oliver Jeffers. In this informative picture book, students have looked at the way the text informs as well as entertains and the different language features that that the author has used to do this. We have also been working to make connections between the content, structure and language features of books we have been reading across the term.



Numeracy

In numeracy we have been looking at data and how to ask questions to create a graph. Students particularly enjoyed working out how to ask 'statistical questions'. For example, "What is 4I's favourite fruit' is a statistical question, whilst "How tall is Ben?" is not. Statistical questions that have more than one answer and allow us to create information in a table or graph.



History

We thoroughly enjoyed our excursion last week to The Rocks in Sydney. We spent time sitting at the Quay hearing all about early explorers and how Sydney harbour was chosen as a site for setting up the first colony. Students also had the opportunity to dress up in clothing from the convicts, and hear about the conditions that convicts lived in. Students were also interested to learn about the impact that colonisation had our First Nations People.









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Stage 3 Update

Literacy

5MJ have been busy working over the past few weeks on their own narratives connected to our focus text the Wild Robot. The students have been working hard to create quality characters that learn, grow and change based on the theme of their story. Together we've investigated the strong themes of belonging, friendship and trust.

Numeracy




This past fortnight, 5MJ have been developing their understanding of fractions. We've used lots of hands on materials including pattern blocks, fraction dice, paper squares and bar models. In particular we've been focusing on adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator and comparing fractions with different denominators.

KLA

In science, 5MJ have conducted an experiment on how mould grows and survives. The students have placed a slice of bread in different locations across the classroom that have differing levels of heat, light and dry or wet condition. Each day the students make observations about their slice of bread and the growth of the mould. We are looking forward to collating our results at the end of the term to see what condition mould grows best!









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
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K-2 Easter Hat Parade

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
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Library Update




