Year 3 will complete their Writing task on paper and Year 5 will complete their Writing assessment online. We ask that all students bring headphones to access the audio content of the assessments. The assessment tasks cover skills in writing, reading, spelling, grammar, punctuation, and numeracy. The testing window will conclude on Monday 24 March. There is no need to prepare for these assessments. If children are absent on their assessment day, they will need to be 'caught up' when they return to school. All tests must be completed within the testing window.

Literacy

Students in Kindergarten have quickly adapted to school life and have been busy learning about school routines and expectations. 





Numeracy

Numbers and patterns! Kindergarten students have been learning about how numbers can be represented in different ways, including numerals, objects, dot patterns and words. They have also been making two and three part patterns using a variety of objects and materials from around the classroom.









Routines and school expectations

Learning how to be at school as been a big milestone and achievement for the students in Kindergarten. It has been a busy few weeks but the students have done incredibly well adjusting to their new surroundings. They have learnt about Larry the Learner, Safe Sadey and Respectful Ralph and they ways these special school crocodiles, the school mascots, can help them to remember these expectations within the classroom and around the school.





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Stage 1 Update - 2D

Literacy

This week, 2D have been creating their own texts based on the book 'The Bad Seed' by Jory John. We love the message that this story gives us and we have based our writing around this message, by focusing on all the ways we can be a good seed, both at home and at school. Numeracy

This week, 2D have been exploring patterns. We have been learning about repeating pattern cores and how to identify the core, as well as how to represent it with letters. We have also been looking at symmetry in mandala patterns and creating our own. This was our favourite part! Have a look at some of our amazing designs. Our pattern journey didn't end there though. We also put our brains to the test and explored number patterns. We took turns creating our own number patterns and finding the rule for each other's patterns.

Science

For science this week, 2D have been learning about the night sky. We discovered that the moon has many different phases and we enjoyed drawing these on the playground with chalk. We also explored constellations, and the highlight of the lesson was creating and naming our own constellations with playdoh and little sticks.









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




Stage 2 Update - 3D

Literacy

In writing, 3D has been diving into persuasive texts, crafting speeches on why they would make great leaders. Students have been learning to use strong reasons and clear explanations to convince their audience! In reading, we've been exploring *Sofia Valdez, Future Prez*, discussing leadership and how young people can make a difference. Inspired by Sofia, students wrote on mini whiteboards about what they would do if they were president.




Numeracy


In Maths, 3D has been working hard on developing their measurement skills. We explored how to estimate and measure objects around the classroom using centimetres, helping us build a stronger understanding of length. Through hands-on activities and discussions, students practiced making predictions before using rulers and measuring tapes to check their accuracy. They enjoyed the challenge of estimating different lengths and comparing their measurements, explaining their thinking along the way.




Science

This week in Science, 3D has been exploring how technology can help humans in different ways. We investigated how robots are used in real life and discussed their benefits, from helping in hospitals to exploring space! Students then got creative, designing their own helpful robots and explaining how they would make life easier. Their ideas were both imaginative and practical, showing a great understanding of technology's role in our world.









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Stage 3 Update

Literacy

Students in 6B have started their literacy journey with *Worse Things* by Sally Murphy. This is a verse novel exploring three main characters dealing with personal struggles on and off the sporting field. The class has been constructing cinquain poems and free verses based on these characters as well as themselves! Additionally we have been studying the themes presented in the novel, namely finding qualities and strengths within yourself that you may have never noticed before.

Numeracy


6B have started off the year jumping straight into decimals which often presents many challenges for students as high school level work comes into view. The class has been experimenting with place value, dividing and multiplying by 10, 100, 1000 and most importantly have applied their knowledge to real life situations. Each and every day we complete mathematics warm-ups and have been improving our Numeracy Ninja scores!

Peer Support

This week, students across Year 6 completed their Peer Support Leadership Training. Looking at the skills of organisation, leadership and empathy, students led and were involved in many group activities. 




The boys team however, had some really tough opponents, but they still tried their hardest, they all scored some baskets and after time we built up a lot of confidence.


